SAFETY TIPS FOR BONFIRE NIGHT

Cork City Council is again running alternative family events to celebrate Bonfire Night. We would encourage people to support these events. See www.corkcity.ie for more details

If you are going to build a bonfire please note the following:

Don't.....Place a bonfire too close to residential or commercial property.

Don't.....Build a bonfire on a road or walkway

Don't.....Build a bonfire too high as it could become unstable and collapse when lit

Don't.....Climb onto or into a bonfire stack

Don't.....use petrol or other flammable liquids to start or rekindle a bonfire.

Don'tthrow pressurised containers, fireworks or tyres onto a bonfire.

Do.....Keep the fire small and controlled

Do.....Ensure the bonfire is supervised by an adult

Do.....Check the bonfire for pets before lighting

Do.....Have a bucket of water ready in case of emergencies.

Do not provide any materials for a bonfire.
